FREEDOM ASCENT & THE A.S

Barry & Desma A. have begun a Freedom Ascent outreach for the Baka community.

Freedom Ascent is a biblical, cross-cultural, and oral based group meeting for those struggling with addiction. The A.s have found that alcohol abuse is the greatest obstacle to growth and biblical leadership in their ministry context.

Between 14 to 20 people have consistently attended the first four meetings. They had anticipated the need to walk around the village, reminding and inviting people, but this proved unnecessary—they simply showed up! The gatherings take place every Monday evening for approximately two hours.

On the day of their third meeting, a severe thunderstorm struck most of the attendees while they were in their fields. They returned home cold and drenched, (an evening best spent near their cooking fires and retiring early), yet they came. Two participants even trekked half a mile through the mud in darkness, but they made it. And they arrived in even greater numbers than the week before!

Even so, the A.s write, "We are sad that some around us who desperately need the freedom God longs to give them are not yet willing to receive it. We continue to pray that they will reach the end of themselves and their fleshly efforts to find freedom and humbly turn to God."

Please pray for the Baka and for the A.s as they seek to help people find freedom from addiction through Christ Jesus our Lord.
