In their last letter, the Sims had asked for prayer for the printing process and safe delivery of the Bibles from across the country to Papua by ship, from the port to the airport and then flown to the individual villages. That has now happened and the date for the dedication is next Wednesday, April 24. Andrew and Anne left on April 18 to join the celebration and thanksgiving to God.

In the meantime, it brought tears to the Sims' eyes as one of the pilots and several Lik friends sent them pictures and videos of rejoicing people when the planes delivered the cartons of Bibles to the various airstrips in anticipation of the dedication ceremony. The Sims mused that if they were this excited with the arrival of the unopened cartons, they could only imagine what it will be like when they have the Bibles in their hands!

And what's next for the Sims? Current plans are to return home in late April. Anne will have a second knee replacement in mid-May. When she is able to travel comfortably, they are planning to visit those who have faithfully partnered with them through the years through prayers and gifts.

Following that, their target retirement date is September 30. They say that it is hard to imagine that they have all reached this day and give all honor and praise to the Lord, as it's been His plan, orchestration, and enablement all along!

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER: Thursday, May 2

On Thursday, May 2, at 6:30 a.m., we will meet in the fellowship hall to pray for our nation, our community, and our church family as we humble ourselves before the Lord. The elders invite and encourage all who can to join us as we pray.

The theme for 2024 is "Lift Up the Word - Light Up the World" and is based on 2 Samuel 22:29-31.

The following is information regarding National Days of Prayer that have taken place in the United States.

National Days of Prayer date back to the founding of our country with the first National Day of Prayer occurring in 1775. The Continental Congress made a proclamation that stated, "a day of public humiliation, fasting and prayer" be created.

In 1863, in the midst of the Civil War, President Lincoln signed a congressional resolution that made April 30th a day of fasting and prayer.

The National Day of Prayer as we know it today was founded in 1952 and was a cooperative effort between the United States Congress and President Harry S. Truman.

In 1988 National Day of Prayer is designated. The law was amended and signed by President Reagan for the day of prayer to be on the first Thursday of May.
